I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL. By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and under authority contained in Circular No 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, 20 March 1944, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

Lieutenant Colonel Matthew F. Murphy, 0170752, Infantry, Headquarters Ninth United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 3 September 1944 to 31 December 1944. Entered military service from Washington.

Lieutenant Colonel James P. Abbott, 0257156, Cavalry, Headquarters Ninth United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 5 September 1944 to 1 December 1944. Entered military service from California.

Major William M. Thames, Jr., 0352723, Signal Corps, Headquarters Ninth United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 1 September 1944 to 4 January 1945. Entered military service from Florida.

Major Emil M. Heisler, 0341908, Quartermaster Corps, Headquarters Ninth United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 28 June 1944 to 1 December 1944. Entered military service from South Dakota.

Captain Richard C. Jacobson, 01100607, Corps of Engineers, Headquarters Ninth United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 20 August 1944 to 1 December 1944. Entered military service from Mississippi.

Captain Ervin D. Hannon, 0398216, Signal Corps, Headquarters Ninth United States Army, for meritorious achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy from 1 September 1944 to 15 October 1944 in Normandy, France. Entered military service from New Jersey.

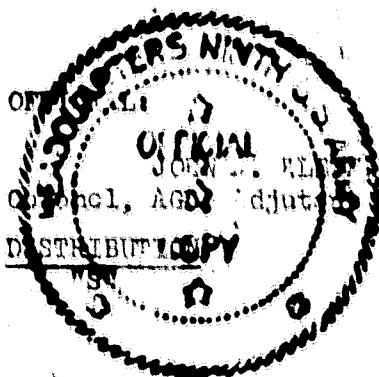
