IV. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL.

1. REVOCATION OF GENERAL ORDERS. Section II, General Orders No 124, this head-quarters, 26 April 1945, which awards the Distinguished-Service Cross, posthumously, to Staff Sorgeant William H. Crabtroe, 34392357, Infantry, 119th Infantry Regiment, 30th Infantry Division, United States Army, is revoked.

II. AWARD OF DISTINGUISHED-SERVICE OROSS. By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and under authority contained in Circular No 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, 20 March 1944, as amended, the Distinguished-Service Cross is awarded to:

/ Staff Sergeant William H. Crabtree, 34392357, Infantry, 119th Infantry Regiment, 30th Infantry Division, United States Arry, for extraordinary hereism in connection with military operations in Germany. On 18 October 1944, Sergeant Crabtree fearlessly remained at his observation post even though he had been wounded and part of his 57mm gun Astroyed. During a full caused by his effective fire which knocked out an energy tank, Sergeant Crabtree moved forward about one hundred yards for better observation. Observing eight energy soldiers leaving a pillbox, Sergeant Crabtree and another soldier opened fire with their rifles and killed or wounded the entire group. Despite his wound, Sergeant Crabtree remained in his advanced position until the enemy counterattack had been repulsed. The extraordinary hereism and coura cous actions of Sorgeant Crabtree reflect great credit upon himself and are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service. Entered, military service from Alabama.

Staff Sorgeant William A. Flesch, 36561685, Infantry, 320th Infantry Regiment, 35th Infantry Division, United States Army, for extraordinary hereism in connection with military operations on 5 March 1945 in Germany. When the advance of his plateen was halted by anemy machine-gun fire while crossing an open field, Sorgeant Fleach complexity disregarding personal danger, dashed to a vantage point, killed an enemy machine gunner and wounded the other number of the crew. During this action, Sorgeant Flesch's plateen certified its advance into an enemy town. Sensing that the plateen was surrounded, Sorgeant Flesch ran a quarter of a mile to the rear to centact friendly tanks. Dismounted, he lad the tanks into the town in support of the riflemen, whereupen on my resistance became disorganised. The extraordinary hereism and courseous actions of Sorgeant Flesch reflect great credit upon himself and are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service. Entered military service from Michigan.

III. AWARD OF DISTINGUISHED-SERVICE CROSS (POSTHOMOUS). By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, as supremor 1943, as amended, and under authority contained in Circular No 32, Headquerters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, 20 March 1944, as amended, the Distinguished-Service Cross is posthumously awarded to:

Captain James M. Watkins, 0351346, Infantry, 320th Infantry Regiment, 35th Infantry Division, United States Arm, for extraordinary heroism in connection

with military operations on 5 March 1945 in Gormany. When a strong enemy force began to encircle an attacking plateon and attached tanks of his company, Captain Watkins quickly organized infantry and tank reserves and led them to the rescue, directing the attack from the deck of the control tank. When the tank was hit by enemy anti-tank and machine-gun fire, Captain Watkins pulled the tank commander from the burning vehicle. As he continued to lead his men from another tank, he was wounded and died before he could be moved to safety. The extraordinary hereism and courageous actions of Captain Watkins reflect great credit upon himself and artin beeping with the highest traditions of the military service. Entered military service from Virginia.

Colonel Harry R. Pierce, 05302, Coast Artillory Corps, 2nd AAA Group, United States Army, for maritorious service in connection with military operations from 24 March 1945 to 17 April 1945. Entered military service from Maine.

Colonel Lester P. Veigel, 019317, Medical Corps, let Medical Group, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations from 23 February 1945 to 15 April 1945. Entered military service from North Dakota.

/ Major Loranco L. Donnis. 0383692, Field Artillery, 272nd Field Artillery Battelian, United States Army, for meritorious service in correction with military operations from 7 August 1944 to 15 April 1945. Entered military service from Michigan.

Captain Arthur Scharf, 01376611, Quartormaster Corps, 195th Quartormaster Cascaline Supply Company, United States Army, for moritorious service in connection with military operations from 1 March 1945 to 12 March 1948. Entered military service from New York.

√ Captain Robert S. Whitney, 0990848, Air Corps, Detachment 2F, 21st Weather Squadron, United States Army, for meriterious service in connection with military operations from 15 September 1946 to 1 Abril 1946. Entered military service from Colerado.
