I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER). By direction of the President, under the provisions of R 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and under authority contained in Circular No 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, 20 March 1944, as amended, in addition to the Bronze Star Medal previously awarded, a bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to:

Lieutenant Colonel William P. Ivry, G3C0061, Corps of Engineers, 148th Engineer Combat Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious achievement in connection with military operations from 16 March 1945 to 2 May 1945. Entered military service from Alabama.

Lieutenant Colonel Paul H. Jordan, G241777, Field Artillery, 34th Field Artillery Brigade, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations from 6 March 1945 to 22 March 1945. Entered military service from Tennessee.

Lieutenant Colonel Glenn E. Pida, G410431, Ordnance Department, 52nd Ordnance Group, United States Army, for meritorious achievement in connection with military operations on 17 December 1944. Entered military service from Ohio.

Major Allen Jones Jr., G366310, Corps of Engineers, 1163rd Engineer Combat Group, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations from 11 April 1945 to 19 April 1945. Entered military service from Georgia.

First Lieutenant Charles K. Whitman, G1178667, Field Artillery, 265th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations from 1 September 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Indiana.

II. AWARD OF AIR MEDAL (SECOND OAK-LEAF CLUSTER). By direction of the President, under the provisions of R 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and under authority contained in Circular No 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, 20 March 1944, as amended, in addition to the Air Medal previously awarded, a second Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to:

First Lieutenant Stanley H. Reeves, G377567, Field Artillery, 272nd Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight from 25 January 1945 to 6 April 1945. Entered military service from Virginia.

First Lieutenant Andrew L. Jarbohn, G1190561, Field Artillery, 266th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight from 2 March 1945 to 5 April 1945. Entered military service from Missouri.

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First Lieutenant William B. Larson, 01183112, Field Artillery, 79th Field Artillery Group, United States Army, for meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight from 22 January 1945 to 11 April 1945. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

First Lieutenant Robert C. Lundquist, 01177064, Field Artillery, 578th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight from 11 January 1945 to 3 March 1945. Entered military service from New Jersey.

First Lieutenant George E. Hanson, 01175789, Field Artillery, 578th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight from 22 January 1945 to 18 March 1945. Entered military service from Illinois.

First Lieutenant John T. McAdams Jr., 01184893, Field Artillery, 692nd Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight from 25 February 1945 to 2 April 1945. Entered military service from Texas.

Second Lieutenant Clarence A. Holton, 01182385, Field Artillery, 578th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight from 21 February 1945 to 18 March 1945. Entered military service from Georgia.

III. REVOCATION OF OTHER I. ORDERS. So much of Section I, General Orders No 215, this headquarters, 11 June 1945, pertaining to the award of Bronze Star Medal to Major Morris Zimmerman, 0204275, Field Artillery, Headquarters, Ninth United States Army, is revoked.
