I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL. By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and under authority contained in Circular No 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, 20 March 1944, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

First Lieutenant Harrison G. Leland, 01551049, Ordnance Department, 506th Quartermaster Car Company, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations from 25 June 1944 to 1 May 1945. Entered military service from New York.

Corporal Armando W. Pardi, 32253156, Quartermaster Corps, 506th Quartermaster Car Company, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations from 4 April 1945 to 1 May 1945. Entered military service from New York.

Technician Fifth Grade Thomas McDonagh, 32085696, (then Private), Quartermaster Corps, 506th Quartermaster Car Company, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations from 3 November 1944 to 1 May 1945. Entered military service from New York.

Private First Class Oliver W. Bezotte, 36185516, Medical Department, 448th Medical Collecting Company, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations from 23 January 1945 to 24 February 1945. Entered military service from Michigan.

Private First Class Morris Cheist, 39704614, (then Private), Quartermaster Corps, 506th Quartermaster Car Company, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations from 1 September 1944 to 1 May 1945. Entered military service from California.

II. AWARD OF AIR MEDAL (THIRD OAK-LEAF CLUSTER). By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and under authority contained in Circular No 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, 20 March 1944, as amended, in addition to the Air Medal previously awarded, a third bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to:

First Lieutenant George R. Manson, 01175789, Field Artillery, 578th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight from 20 March 1945 to 25 April 1945. Entered military service from Illinois.

Second Lieutenant Cirrence A. Holton, 01182385, Field Artillery, 573th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army, for meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight from 19 March 1945 to 31 March 1945. Entered military service from Georgia.

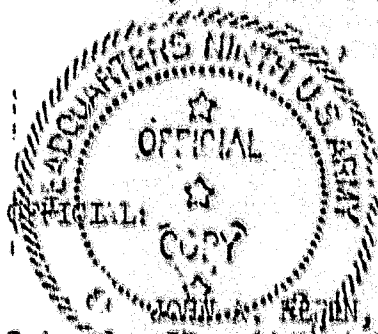
