I. AWARD OF SOLDIER'S MEDAL. By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and under authority contained in Circular No 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, 20 March 1944, as amended, the Soldier's Medal is awarded to:

Technician Fifth Grade Joseph J. Tedesco, 32783211, Quartermaster Corps, 3574th Quartermaster Truck Company, United States Army, for heroism and courageous action. On 3 November 1944 in France, Technician Tedesco, with complete disregard for his own personal safety voluntarily dived into a lake and rescued an unconscious soldier from the overturned cab of a submerged truck. Through his immediate action and gallantry Technician Tedesco saved a soldier from certain death. The heroism and courage of Technician Tedesco reflect much credit upon himself and uphold the highest traditions of the military service. Entered military service from New York.


