ORIGINAL ORDER

AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL

1. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

Staff Sergeant GEORGE C MC GOWAN, 33237314, Company "C", 1266th Engineer Combat Battalion, United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in GERMANY. Sergeant MC GOWAN was one of five men who captured the crew of a German airplane on 1 May 1945 after one of the group had caused it to crash near LINT, GERMANY, with fire from his M-1 rifle. His quick thinking action and initiative merit high commendation.

2. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States, during the respective periods indicated, to:

Major LESLIE M BAKER, 0379523, Medical Corps, Headquarters 437th Medical Battalion, United States Army. 15 July 1944 to 1 January 1945 in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG, and BELGIUM.

Major KENNETH W PRICE, 01542339, Medical Administrative Corps, Headquarters 69th Medical Group, United States Army. 1 August 1944 to 1 May 1945 in FRANCE, LUXELBOURG, and GERMANY.

Major WILLARD B WELLS, 0243623, Corps of Engineers, 2d Battalion, 1301st Engineer General Service Regiment, United States Army. 1 April 1945 to 15 April 1945 in GERMANY.

Captain JOSEPH L ALLEN, 01576971, Ordnance Department, Headquarters 314th Ordnance Battalion, United States Army. 3 August 1944 to 14 April 1945 in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG, and GERMANY.

First Lieutenant GORDON L JOHNSON, 01110026, Corps of Engineers, Company "D", 1301st Engineer General Service Regiment, United States Army. 22 March 1945 to 15 April 1945 in GERMANY.

First Lieutenant MICHAEL C STARKE, 01116189, Corps of Engineers, Company "E", 1301st Engineer General Service Regiment, United States Army. 22 March 1945 to 15 April 1945 in GERMANY.


