For meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the period 17 April 1945 to 6 May 1945 in GENIANY.

ITT - AMARD OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL. By direction of the President and under the provisions of Section I, Gircular Number 32, Headquarters, European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 20 March 1944, as amended by Section I, Circular Number 56, Headquarters, European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following officer:

Captain BURNOWES G. STEVENS, JR., 025950, Infantry, Company "B", 357th Infantry, United States Army. For horoic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United states in FRANCE. During the period & September 1944 to 10 September 1944, Captain STEVENS, commanding Company "B", 357th Infantry, had the mission of providing the advance guard for his battalian. Proceding the battalian, he seized ground at Trieux, France, repelling German counterattacks until the battalian could occupy the ground. Again preceding the battalian, he avercame German resistance and captured the town of Neufchof, France, which provided a springboard for the attack on Hayange, France, that followed a day later. Captain STEVENS' aggressiveness, sound military judgment and hereig achievement reflect credit upon himself and are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service.

IV - AJARD OF THE BRONZE STAR LEDAL. By direction of the President and under the provisions of Section I, Circular Number 32, Headquarters, European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 20 March 1944, as amended by Section I, Circular Number 56, Headquarters, European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following enlisted mun:

United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in CERMANY. On 23 January 1945, in Jasserbillig, Germany, Staff Jergeant BMITTENHAM and another soldier were holding a three-stary builling against enemy attacks which were frequent and of intense ferocity. After being surrounded, a fresh counterattack was launched by the enemy. Sergeant BMITTENHAM, haroically exposing himself to heavy machine gun fire, fire at the leader of the enemy troops, killing him instantly. This act stalled the attack lang enough to secure a better defensive position and repulse new attacks. Valuable information was obtained, upon inspection of the leader's body, in connection with energy plans of future moves, used later to a great advantage. Sorg and EMITTENHAM's courage and initiative reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.
