I. AWARD OF THE MRONZE STAR MEMAL. By direction of the President and under the provisit ms of Section I, Oficular 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 20 Larch 1944, as amended by Section I, Circular 56, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 27 Key 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

Major Albert H. HISLOP, 0-376256, Cavalry, 19th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron, United States Army. For hereic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in GENUMY. On 13 March 1945, his communiting officer of Troop C, 19th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron, Major is communiting officer of Troop C, 19th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron, Major AHSLOP was ordered to attack the town of SOMMEMU, GENUMY. Finding mechanized approach barred by extensive mine fields, he organized his troop into two dismounted parties, and led them through the cover of woods to the outskirts of the town, where fire of small arms and machine guns was poured on the enemy. In completing this took, Major HISLOP disregarded the danger of sniper fire, artillery fire and booby traps which the enemy had planted in the words. His skillful maneuvering and personal courage set a high example for his men and resulted in the capture of enemy position with a cost of only two casualties. The bravery, skill and leadership displayed by Major HISLOP reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

II. AWARD OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL. By direction of the President and under the provisions of Section I, Circular 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 20 March 1944, as amended by Section I, Circular 56, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

First Licutement BEVENLY C. BARSTON, O-1032574, Cavalry, 19th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron (Mechanizel), United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in GENMANY. On 15 March 1945, engaged in Hirceting a fire mission on enemy positions, First Lieutement BARSTON and his platoon of assault guns were caught in an intensive artillery barrage coming from enemy guns about 6000 yards distant, in which his guns were knocked out and telephone wires leading to the radio station were severed. With little or no cover Lieutement BARSTON carried the information on the enemy gun positions a distance of 500 yards to the radio station, furnishing data which enabled supporting guns to silence enemy artillery. In courying the information through, Identenant BARSTON was knocked down by shell fire and suffered an impairment of his hearing. His courageous action made possible the movement of his troop to a protected position from which further fire could be directed at the enemy. The courage, utter disregard for personal safety and superior efficiency of Lieutemant BARSTON reflect the highest traditions of the Unite? States Army.
