I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I. Wir 32, Mg ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I. Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

Battalion, United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States from 13 to 15 April 1945. While on a reconnaissance mission with another efficer and two enlisted mon near WISEN-FIELS, GERMANY, Lieutenant GRAVES braved heavy enemy fire to reach his objective. Displaying cool leadership, he secured a guard for valuable Ordnance material in the area, established a perimeter defense and courageously continued to make a theoreugh search for additional enemy soldiers, capturing several personally-upon himself and the military service.

First Licutement HARCLD K SHARP, 01593261, Quartermester Corps, 501st Quarter-master Railhead Company, United States Army. For hereic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States on 18 March 1945. During an enemy air attack on the company area in GERMANY, an anti-personnel bemb was dropped in a billet housing two wounded men, and lay unexploded in the building. With utter disregard for his own safety, Lieutenant SHARP courageously entered the building and with the assistance of another efficer carried the wounded men to safety. His hereic actions and unswerving devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

Second Licutement KENTETH S ALLEN, 02005632, quartermaster Corps, 501st Quartermaster Railhead Company, United States Army. For heroic achievement in commection with malitary operations against an enemy of the United States on 18 March 1945. During an enemy air attack on the company area in GERMANY, an anti-personnel bomb was dropped in a billet housing two wounded men, and lay unexpleded in the building. With utter disrepard for his own safety, Lieutenant ALLEM courageously entered the building and with the assistance of another efficer, carried the wounded men to safety. His heroic actions and unswerving devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

Technical Sergeant KARL MARCE, 32119437. Headquarters Detachment, 177th Ordannee Battalien, United States Army. For hereit achievement in connection with
military operations against an enemy of the United States from 13 to 15 April 1916.


