Staff Sergeant EDMARD M TRANSUE, 33272391, 385th Infantry Regiment, 76th Infantry Livision, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy in GERMANY. During action near GROSSLITTGEN, GERMANY, on 9 March 1945, Sergeant TRANSUE fearlessly advanced through intense enemy small arms and machine gun fire and killed a sniper who had been harassing the advancing elements. Setting up his machine gun section in a fullding he boldly exposed himself in order to more accurately adjust fire and knocked out an enemy 20mm gun, picked off a sniper, silenced an enemy machine gun and then, in full view of the enemy, killed another sniper with two rounds from his carbine. Sergeant TRANSUE'S heroic and aggressive actions reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

Although weakened by the frantic struggling of the drowning man, he continued his efforts until, as he was being dragged under the strace for the third time. The low soldier swam to him with a life preserver. Technician MANNING'S haver, inselfish actions reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.
