AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL

1. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Mq ETO US Army, 20 Par 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Mq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Pronze Star Medal is awarded posthumously to:

Technician Fifth Grade CHIRLES A BOOTHIAN, 16127639, 531st Ordnance Heavy Jaintenance Company (Tanh), United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. Technician Fifth Grade BOOTHIAN was a member of an evacuation wrecker crew of the 531st Ordnance Heavy Jaintenance Company, Tank, which, on 6 July 1914, was under orders to clear disabled tanks from a road near LA HAYE DU PUITS, FRANCE. Dispite a heavy enomy artillery and mortar barrage which was laid on the immediate area, Technician Fifth Grade BOOTHIAN bravely continued at his task until the mission was accomplished, disregarding his own safety. His courage, resourcefulness and loyal devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military forces of the United States.

2. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1914, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1914, a Bronze Star Month is awarded to:

Technician Fifth Grade ROCCO S VIGNA, 31347064, 107th Evacuation Hospital, United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States on 17 December 1944. The superior manner in which Technician VIGA performed his duties as surgical technician while serving with the 107th Evacuation Hospital distinguish him as an outstanding soldier. His services in the hospital installation at MALMEDY, BELGIUM were particularly noteworthy and merit high commendation. Technician Fifth Grade VICHA's accomplishments and his loyal devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military forces of the United States.

Technician Fifth Grade TRUINN R FULTON, 37379691, 2d Ordnance Indium Indintenance Company, United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. On 9 June 1944, enemy shore batteries inflicted serious casualties on board the Liberty Chiesen SS Ezra Weston. Technician Fifth Grade FULTON, crossing on the ship, though not trained in specialized first aid, remained courageously on the exposed deck and administered first aid to the wounded. He acted without direction completely disregarding his own safety and was responsible for saving many lives. Technician Fifth Grade FULTON's coolness under fire and his supreme devotion to duty distinguish him as an outstanding soldier and merit high commendation.

Hajor PERCY D WIDIER, 0503707, Infantry, Headquarters Third United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an onomy of the United States in the UNITED KINGDON and FRANCE from 15 May 1944 to 15 Jan 1915.



Corporal AMESTAS A CHARLIE, 36571952, Company "B", 503d Military Police Ractalion, Upited States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 1 August 19hl to 30 December 19hl.

First Sergeant THOLAS A EROWHING, 6267722, Company "B", 503d lilitary Police Pattalion, United States Army. For meritorious service in cornection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 6 July 1914 to 22 December 1914.
