AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL

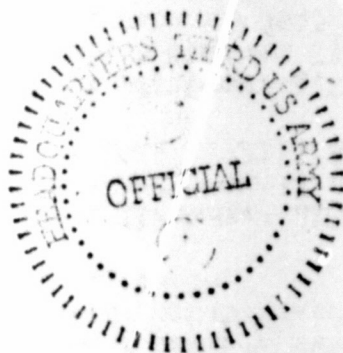

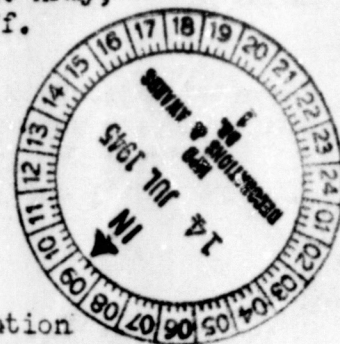
