AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL

1. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

Technician Fifth Grade JENNY MIKSOVSKY, 36762383, Medical Detachment, 36th Chemical Mortar Battalion, United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in GERMANY. On 3 November 1944, near JOSSENACK, GERMANY, Technician Fifth Grade MIKSOVSKY'S platoon was subjected to intense enemy machine gun, automatic weapons and rifle fire, which seriously wounded two of his comrades. With utter disregard for his own safety he left cover, administered first aid and with the assistance of two comrades evacuated the wounded men to an aid station. Technician Fifth Grade MIKSOVSKY'S gallant, unselfish actions and extreme coolness in the face of heavy enemy fire reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

Technician Fifth Grade YOENLEE RATHER, 35702237, Battery C, 770th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in GERMANY. On 2 March 1945, near KORSCHIED, GERMANY, when an M-5 tractor hauling a trailer loaded with high explosive ammunition became ignited, Technician Fifth Grade RATHER fearlessly assisted in uncoupling the trailer and prevented serious damage to personnel and equipment. Although he realized the burning tractor was also loaded with explosives and that his own life was endangered, he worked with courage to protect the lives of his comrades and valuable government property.

Technician Fifth Grade RATHER'S heroic actions and unswerving devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

Captain PHILIP SCHEIDT, 01551511, Ordnance Department, Headquarters 7th Ordnance Group, United States Army. 1 June 1944 to 1 May 1945 in the UNITED KINGDOM, FRANCE and GERMANY.

Captain CARROLL W WRIGHT, 01035625, Chemical Warfare Service, 39d Chemical Decontaminating Company, United States Army. 1 June 1944 to 8 May 1945 in the UNITED KINGDOM, FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG and GERMANY.

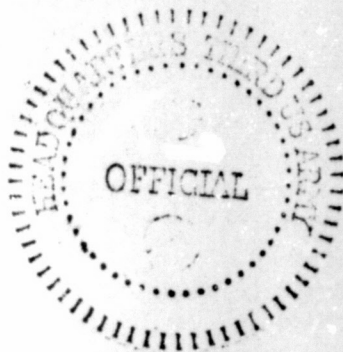
