I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER) - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Bronze Star Medal previously awarded, a Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to:

First Lieutenant FRANKLIN F FROCK, O1105441, Corps of Engineers, 995th Engineer Treadway Bridge Company, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in GERMANY from 22 March 1945 to 28 March 1945.

II. AWARD BRONZE STAR MEDAL - 1. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded posthumously to:

Private ALBERT P ZEMS, 39281706, Battery B, 390th Antiaircraft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion, United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in LUXEMBOURG. On 3 January 1945, when a pocket of enemy troops had halted the advance of friendly elements near NOTHAM, LUXEMBOURG, Private ZEMS fearlessly exposed himself to intense hostile artillery, mortar and small arms fire to operate his two machine guns with great effectiveness. Although his position was in full view of the enemy he maintained such a constant stream of fire from the guns that a large number of hostile troops were killed, wounded or taken prisoner and friendly foot troops were enabled to continue their advance. Private ZEMS' heroic actions and unflinching devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

2. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Colonel WILLIAM G HOLDER, O12665, Coast Artillery Corps, Headquarters 54th Antiaircraft Artillery Brigade, United States Army. 1 June 1944 to 5 March 1945 in the UNITED KINGDOM, FRANCE and GERMANY.

Lieutenant Colonel LOUIS V GERMAIN, O390263, Signal Corps, Headquarters Third United States Army. 1 June 1944 to 8 May 1945 in the UNITED KINGDOM, FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG and GERMANY.

Major RICHARD T MADDOCK, O293474, Coast Artillery Corps, Headquarters 482d Antiaircraft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion (Self-Propelled), United States Army. *GC 199 this Hq cs received a limited distribution. (over)

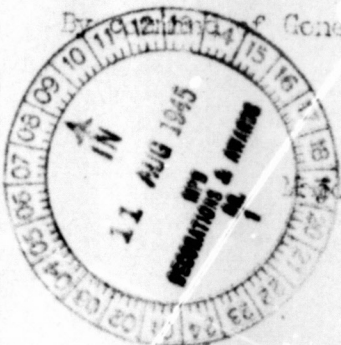
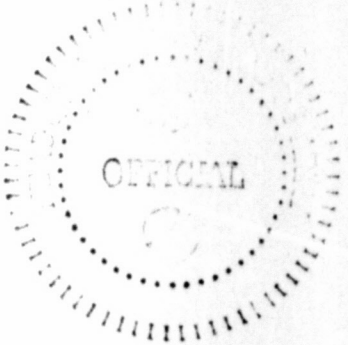

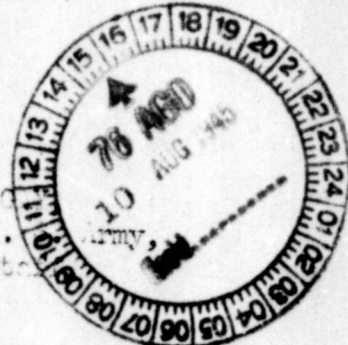
