L - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Ho ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Ho ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to: Technician Fifth Grade ROBERT C HOPP JR, 36120378, Battery A, 482d Antiair-craft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion (Self-Fropelled), United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in LUXEMBOURG. On 18 December 1944, near HALLER, LUXEMBOURG, Technician Fifth Grade (then Private First Class) HOPP fearlessly volunteered to

craft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion (Self-Propelled), United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in LUXEMBOURG. On 18 December 1944, near HALLER, LUXEMBOURG, Technician Fifth Grade (then Private First Class) HOPP fearlessly volunteered to enter enemy territory under the cover of darkness to evacuate three seriously wounded comrades. With utter disregard for his own safety, he drove his jeep across unfamiliar terrain which was swept by hostile artillery and small arms fire and reaching the wounded men, loaded them on his vehicle and brought them to safety behind friendly lines. Technician Fifth Grade HOPP'S courageous actions and unswerving devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the militar service.

Private First Class JOHN J GARCIA, 39508207, Battery A, 170th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with militar operations against an enemy of the United States in GERMANY. On 29 April 1945, Private GARCIA courageously volunteered as one of a party of three to attempt to capture an enemy soldier who had crossed the Danube River near MEHRING, GERMANY, and infiltrated into American lines. When the enemy soldier was observed taking cover behind a wood pile, Private GARCIA courageously advanced to within four yards of the pile and in the sharp, close-range fire fight which ensued, succeede in wounding the enemy soldier several times and capturing him. Private GARCIA'S heroic actions and unflinching devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.
