I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER) - 1. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Bronze Star Medal and one Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster previously awarded, a second Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to:

Lieutenant Colonel RICHARD R SEIBEL, O321779, Infantry, Combat Command B, 11th Armored Division, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in BELGIUM, LUXEMBOURG, GERMANY and AUSTRIA from 30 December 1944 to 8 May 1945.

2. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Bronze Star Medal previously awarded, a Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Lieutenant Colonel HUGH BELDEN, O294528, Field Artillery, Headquarters 35th Division Artillery, United States Army. 1 September 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, BELGIUM, LUXEMBOURG, HOLLAND and GERMANY.

Lieutenant Colonel EARLE A BERRY, K100028, United States Coast and Geodetic Survey, Headquarters 17th Field Artillery Observation Battalion, United States Army. 8 Jun 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, BELGIUM, GERMANY and CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

Lieutenant Colonel CHARLES F WHITE, O285841, Field Artillery, Headquarters 208th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. 2 August 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE and GERMANY.

Major FRANK B WADE, O347094, Infantry, Headquarters 39th Infantry Regiment, 9th Infantry Division, United States Army. 8 October 1944 to 26 January 1945 in BELGIUM and GERMANY.

II. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Major JOHN E SHIRLEY, O352763, Coast Artillery Corps, Headquarters Third United States Army. 15 August 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG and GERMANY.

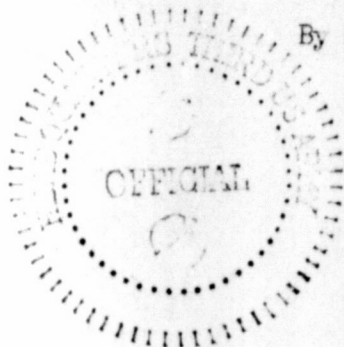
