I. ANNOUNCEMENT OF ACTING ASSISTANT CHIEF OF STAFF, G-2 - Lieutenant Colonel EDWARD J SCHUBCK, O349795, General Staff Corps, this Headquarters, is announced as Acting Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, Third United States Army, during the temporary absence of Colonel OSCAR W KOCH, O10851, General Staff Corps, effective 19 August 1945.

II. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Major HAROLD HALLER, O347044, Adjutant General's Department, United States Group Control Council, United States Army. 1 August 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG and GERMANY.

Major CHARLES W PEMBERTON, O470637, Medical Corps, 58th Field Hospital, United States Army. 20 November 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG and GERMANY.

Captain SAM J FERTITTA, O1107410, Corps of Engineers, 1134th Engineer Combat Group, United States Army. 17 January 1945 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG and GERMANY.
