I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER) - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Bronze Star Medal previously awarded, a Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to:

Lieutenant Colonel REGINALD A MAURER, 0180740, Field Artillery, Headquarters 26th Division Artillery, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States from 8 December 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG, GERMANY, AUSTRIA and CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

II. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Technical Sergeant ROLLIN G WELLS, 18081441, Headquarters Third United States Army. 1 August 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG and GERMANY.

Sergeant WASSIL A TUR, 36131043, Headquarters Battery, 284th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. 18 August 1944 to 28 January 1945 in FRANCE and GERMANY.

III. AWARD OF AIR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER) - 1. 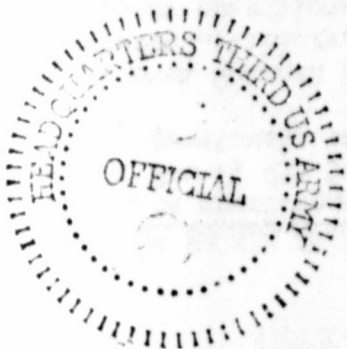
