I. AWARD OF AIR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER) - 1. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Air Medal and five Bronze Oak-Leaf Clusters previously awarded, a sixth Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to:

Captain ROBERT K MOORE, 01181700, Field Artillery, Headquarters Division Artillery, 10th Armored Division, United States Army. For meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in GERMANY on 3 March 1945.

2. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Air Medal and two Bronze Oak-Leaf Clusters previously awarded, a third Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to:

Captain MILTON E MILLER, 01180622, Field Artillery, Headquarters XXII Corps, United States Army. For meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in ITALY on 18 June 1944.

3. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Air Medal and one Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster previously awarded, a second Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to:

First Lieutenant WILLIAM SHERRY, 01174437, Field Artillery, Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 689th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in GERMANY from 17 February 1945 to 27 February 1945.

II. AMENDMENT TO GENERAL ORDERS NUMBER 80 THIS HQ CS - So much of Section I, General Orders Number 80, this Headquarters, cs, awarding a Bronze Star Medal to Technician Fifth Grade PAUL N PETROFF, 32980591, as reads: "1 October 1944 to 1 February 1945" is amended to read: "1 October 1944 to 17 December 1944."

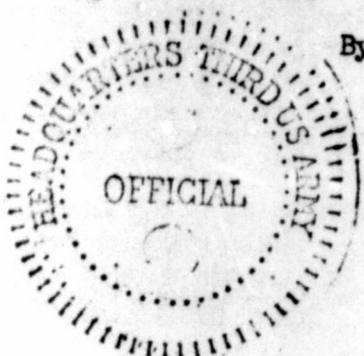
