I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL

1. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Lieutenant Colonel RICHARD J. STILLMAN, O25038, Infantry, G-3 Section, Headquarters Third U. S. Army, United States Army. 1 August 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG, BELGIUM, and GERMANY.

Technician Fourth Grade DEAN P. BROWN, 37740196, Company A, 1263rd Engineer Combat Battalion, United States Army. 12 March 1945 to 6 May 1945 in NOLLAND and GERMANY.

2. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

Private First Class STANLEY GOLDBERG, 3277900, Medical Detachment, 473rd Antiaircraft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion (Self-propelled), United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE. On 1 August 1944 during an air attack near AVIARMACHES, FRANCE, Private GOLDBERG fearlessly exposed himself to hostile bombing and strafing and went to the aid of two wounded men. With utter disregard for his own safety he treated the wounds of the injured men and evacuated them to a field hospital. He then returned to his unit to render any assistance that may have been necessary, driving over roads that were under constant enemy attack. Private GOLDBERG'S heroic actions and unflinching devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

II. AWARD OF AIR MEDAL (OAK LEAF CLUSTER) 1. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Air Medal and eight Bronze Oak-leaf Clusters previously awarded, a ninth Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to:

First Lieutenant ERIC L. BARCLAY, O1176247, Field Artillery, 212th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in GERMANY on 27 March 1945.
