AWARD OF DISTINCTUISHED SERVICE OROSS - By Directio of the President and under the revisions of Sec 1, Cir 32, 11q ETO US Army, 20 March 1914, as amended by Sec 1 sir 56, Ho MTO US Army, 27 May 19/4, the Distinguished Service Cross is awarded to:

Lieutenant Colonel DELK M'ODEL, 020805, Cavalry, Hendquarters 35th Tank Battalion, 4th Armored Division, United States Army. For extraordinary hereism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy in CERIALIY. On 26 March 1945, during operations near GUISSEN, GERMANY, Colonel ODEN fearlessly maintained position at the head of his armored task force although suffering from a wound received a few days proviously. Then blown out of his tank by a direct hit from an enemy 66mm gun which killed his guinner and set fire to the tank this dountless officer mounted another tank and continued to load the attack. Inspired by his intropid gallantry, the task force drove forward to inflict tramendous losses of men and material upon the enemy. Colonel ODEN'S hereis leadership and indomitable lighting spirit are in keeping wit the fine est traditions of the military service.

II. Liquitonant Colonel ROBERT P ROCTE, 0307274, General Staff Corps, Headquarters, 90th Infantry Division, United States Army, 'For gallantry in action in CERMANY. During Piones action near HABSCHEID, GENERALY, in 6 - 7 February 1915, Colonel BOOTH porsonally lad his bettalion through withoring enemy small arms, automatto manpans, morto and artillory fire in a gallant assault against etroughy dopositions. Inspired by his example of heroic leadership. fonded Slogfried nemy and secured their objective in the face of everabeling Me non routed odds. By contile by exposing himself to enemy fire in order to visit even the smallest of his write he maintained a high state of morale among his troops and was ablo to direct attacks on individual objectives. Colonel BOOTH'S dauntless nations and inspirational courage are in keeping with the finest traditions of the military s rvice.

Captain JOSEPH F KISUM. 01290010. Infantry, headquarters 3d Battalian, 411th Infantry Regiment, United States Army. For gallentry in action in GERIVITY. On 28 April 1945, Captain KiSUN fearlessly led his company forward against flores change resistance in an attempt to capture the city of LANDSDERO, GERIVITY. With his company ambushed and split in two sections by enemy action, he gallantly continued forward with a small force of mon and audaciously assaulted the city. Exhibiting daring, aggressive leadership, this intropid officer so skilfully deployed his small group that an enemy commander, believing himself surreunded by a large force, surrendered his entire garrison of approximately one thousand mone. Captain KASUN 8 dauntless, hereig actions and maswerving devotion to duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service.
