1. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944 a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Major SIMON P F HAZARD 16484, Field Artillery, 17th Fusilier Battalion (Belgian), Belgian Army. 7 March 1945 to 8 May 1945 in BELGIUM and GERMANY. ✓

Major CHARLES E HOY, 0394824, Quartermaster Corps, Third United States Army. 1 August 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG and GERMANY. ✓

Major FRANK KEMMERER, 0466914, Quartermaster Corps, Headquarters Third United States Army. 1 August 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG, and GERMANY. ✓

Master Sergeant ROBERT W SCHLUED 32017624, Headquarters XI Corps Artillery, United States Army. 1 June 1944 to 8 May 1945 in UNITED KINGDOM, FRANCE, GERMANY, and AUSTRIA. ✓

Staff Sergeant EDWARD T WEINER, 32311693, 45th Reconnaissance Troop, 45th Infantry Division, United States Army. 20 November 1944 to 4 May 1945 in FRANCE, GERMANY, and AUSTRIA. ✓

2. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

First Lieutenant JOHN T COLMACK JR, 61580783, Quartermaster Corps, 3685th Quartermaster Truck Company (TC), United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE. On 22 June 1944, enemy aircraft attacked an ammunition convoy near BRIQUEBECK, FRANCE, setting fire to seven trucks loaded with ammunition. Lieutenant COLMACK, with utter disregard for his own safety, fearlessly drove three trucks from the dangerous area and assisted in removing the remainder of the vehicles. His heroic actions saved many tons of ammunition. Lieutenant COLMACK'S personal courage and unflinching devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service. ✓

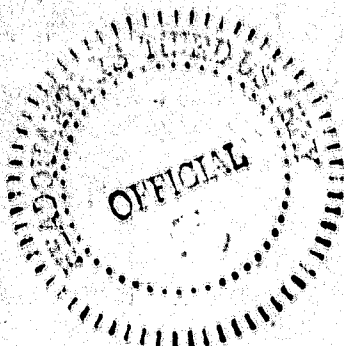
