AMARD OF SILVER STAR - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec 1, Cir 32, Hq kilo US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Silver Star is awarded to:

Colonel COMMELIUS A LICHIRIE, 018371, Cavalry, Headquarters Division Trains, 10th Armored Division, United States Army. For gallantry in action in GERMANY. On 21 March 1945, during an advance on ST HARTIN, GERMANY, Colonel (then Lieutenant Colonel) LICHIRIE fearlessly read a lone reconnaissance of enemy held terrain and secured information which erabled his mechanized squadron to by-pass an enemy rocublock and continue their attack. Later that day he courageously braved intense hortile small arms, machine gun and rocket fire and led a dismounted patrol o successfully neutralise an enemy strongpoint. The next morning, when intense enery automatic weapone fire halted the advance of his column, he audmeieusly manned a tank-counted machine gun and silvaced one of the hostile positions. Colonel LICHIBIE to heroic leadership and gallant actions are in keeping with the finest traditions of the military service.

Captain Male Cocks JR, 0441300, Infantry, Headquarters 103d Infantry Division, United States Army. For gallantry in action in GERMANY. During the period 22 - 24 April 1945, while engaged in a series of actions against the enemy in KIRCHHEIM, UNION and OBERGLIZINGEN, GERMANY, Captain COCKE repentedly displayed great personal courage and herois leadership. Fearlessly entering an enemy-held term while attempting to contact an isolated battalion, he eaptured three prisoners, but was later captured himself by a numerically superior hostile force. While marching to the rear he nudrotously obtained food and rest for his fellow prisoners and assisted one of those to uscape. This intropid officer later accomplished the surrender of 200 enemy soldiers and captured an additional forty, but was severly wounder in a subsequent fire-fight against overwhelming odds and re-captured. Capitain OCCKE's useur disregard for his personal safety and fearless, aggressive actions are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service.

Captain Filliam K COOLRICK UR 0438144, Infantry, Headquarters Third United States Army. For millantry in action in FRANCE. On 11 November 1944, near ROWNIGHTUCKER, FRANCE, Captain COOLRICK functionally exposed himself to intense heatile small arms, mortar, and artillery fire to make a reconnaisesance of a bittorly defended area. With etter disregard for his own safety, this intropid efficer proceeded forward, crossed the flooded Mesulle River, advanced beyond friendly elements and audaciously used an untravelled, enemy-sined rend in order to accomplish his mission. Captain COOLRICK'S heroid actions and unflinehing devotion to duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service
