I. AWARD OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CLOSS - By Direction of the Prosident and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETC US Army, 20 par 19h4, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETC US Army, 27 May 19h4, a Distinguished Service Gress is awarded to:

Regiment, 80th Infantry Division, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy. On 11 Nevember 1944, Major CRAIG personally led a small group of the 1st Eattalion, 317th Infantry to capture, intact, the one remaining bridge over the MIED RIVER near HAM-SUR-MIED. FRANCE. His gallant, fearless example inspired his troops to capture the bridge in spite of fierce enemy fire and to press on and establish a bridgehead on the far side of the river. Major CRAIG'S outstanding heroism and supreme devotion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the service.

Sergeant PAUL PORTER, 36494989, Company "B", 53d Armored Infantry Battalian, 4th Armored Division, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy. On 4 December 1944 during action to capture the town of DOMESSEL, FRANCE, Sergeant PORTER distinguished himself by his repeated acts of heroism. Completely disregarding his own safety he fought his way boldly through the town, fearlessly engaging the enemy in hand to hand combat wherever he encountered them. Sergeant PORTER was severely wounded while bravely attempting to rescue a wounded medical aid man. His unselfish ourage, exemplary heroism and supreme devotion to duty are in keeping with highest traditions of the military service.

Private First Class ELMER A EGGERT, 36357319, Company "L", 379th Interestinant, 95th Infantry Division, United States Army. For extraordinary him connection with military operations against an armed enemy. On 16 Novem 1914, during an attack by the 379th Infantry upon heavily fortified positionear GRAVELOTTE, FRANCE, private EGGERT boldly assaulted a machine which intense fire was being directed against the 3d Battalion of the emptied his automatic rifle into the nest, withdrew to relocate lessly assaulted the position again. By his heroic determination and captured four of the enemy. Private EGGERT'S conspicuous by devotion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the military section.
