I. Lieutenant Colonel HENRY T CHERRY JR, O19888, General Staff Corps, this Headquarters is announced as Acting Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3, Headquarters Third United States Army, during the temporary absence of Brigadier General HALLEY G MADDOX.

II. AWARD OF SILVER STAR - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Silver Star is awarded to:

Private HENRY J MUELLER, 39612619, Company I, 323th Infantry Regiment, 26th Infantry Division, United States Army. For gallantry in action in LUXEMBOURG. On 2 January 1945, Private MUELLER'S company was pinned down by intense hostile machine gun fire from dug-in positions near NOTHUR, LUXEMBOURG. Displaying fearless courage, he crawled towards an enemy machine gun, hurled a grenade into the emplacement and then charged the position, firing his BAR as he ran. He killed the remaining members of the enemy crew and the occupants of two fox holes nearby. Private MUELLER'S heroic, aggressive actions enabled his company to move forward and outflank the enemy. His indomitable fighting spirit is in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service.

III. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Captain CLARENCE E JACK, O305497, Infantry, Detachment DP-8, attached to Headquarters Third United States Army. 11 December 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE and GERMANY.

Master Sergeant ALVIN A NOULLET, 34271407, 116th Signal Radio Intelligence Company, United States Army. 9 August 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, BELGIUM and LUXEMBOURG.

IV. AWARD OF AIR MEDAL - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, an Air Medal is awarded to:

First Lieutenant PHILIP P YOUNG, O1168989, Field Artillery, Battery C, 170th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in GERMANY from 24 March 1945 to 20 April 1945.

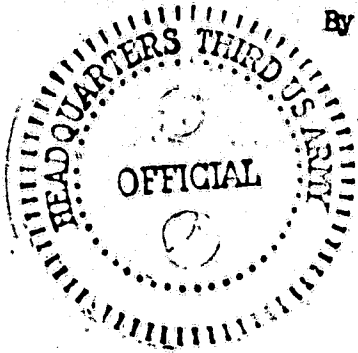
