I. Licutement Colonel HENRY T CHERRY JR, 919888, General Staff Corps, this Headquarters is announced as Acting Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3, Headquarters Third United States Army, during the temporary absence of Brigadier General HALLEY G MADDOX.

II. AWARD OF SILVER SEAR - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq STO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Silver Star is awarded to:

Private HENRY J MUELLER, 39612619, Company L, 328th Infantry Regiment, 26th Infantry Division, United States army. For gallantry in action in LUXMIBOURG. On 2 January 1945, Private LUELLER'S company was pinned down by intense hostile machine gun fire from dug-in positions near NOTHUM, LUXER BOURG. Displaying fearless courage, he crawled towards on enemy machine gun, hurled a grunade into the emplacement and then charged the position. firing his BAR as he ran. He killed the remaining members of the enemy crew and the occupants of two fox holes nearby. Private MUELLER'S heroic, aggressive actions enabled his company to move forward and outflank the enemy. His indomitable fighting spirit is in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service.

III. ALARD OF REOFZE STAR MEDAL - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq MTO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Captain CLARENCE E JACK, 0305497, Infantry, Detachment DP-8, attached to Hondquarters Third United States Army. 11 December 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE and GERMANY.

Master Sergeant ALVIN & NOULLET, 34271407, 116th Signal Radio Intelligence Company, United States Army. 9 August 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, BILGIUM and LUXEMBOURG.


