I. AWARD OF SILVER STAR - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Ht, ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US kmay, 27 May 1944, a Silver Star is awarded to:

First Lieutenant JOHN F JOY, 01296703, Infantry, Reconnaissance Company, 818thTank Destroyer Battalion, United States Army. For gallantry in action in FRANCE. On 13 November 1944, before our thinly-held bridgehead across the Neid-Francaise River near SAMRY-SUR-NEID, FRANCE, could be reinforced, enemy infentry counterattacked under a concentrated artillery barrage and threatened to drive our forces back to the friendly shore. Acting on his own initiative, Lieutenant defensive positions along the entire front, traveling JOY hastily roorgeneed its length under heavy chony fire to rally troops, direct employment of field pieces and control the fire of all calibers of guns. When the hostile attack reached its peak, he fearlessly went to the mid of fallen comrades and assisted in their evacuation. Through Lieutenant JOY'S inspiring leadership, the enemy attack was finally repulsed. His outstanding hereism and untiring devotion to

Sorgeant JOHN & HERBACYNKO 32254301, Company D, 35th Tank Battalion, 4th Armored Division, United States army. For gallentry in action in GERMANY. On 29 March 1945, in an assault on ASPACH, GERMANY, after hostile rocket fire had disabled Sergeant HERBACYNKO'S tank, killed his tank commander and gunner and caused temporary blindness to himself, he crawled 200 yards and took cover in a nearby creck from the intense hail of enemy sniper fire directed at him. When medium tanks were brought up to reinforce the attack, he courageously mounted one of them and fired the .50 calibor anticircraft gun from the rear dock. At the same time he directed the other tanks against the houses in which snipers and rocket crows were holding out, until all the enemy were cleared from the town. Sorgoant HERBACYNKO'S dauntless heroism and unflinching devotion to duty are in kooping with the highest traditions of the military service.

First Lioutenant ROBERT C ANDERSON, 0462811, Field Artillory, 4263d Quartermaster Truck Company, United States army. For wounds received as a direct result of enemy action on 25 July 1944 at ST LO, FRINCE.


