I. M.RD OF DISTINGUISED SEEVICE CROSS (FUCTHENOUS) - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Unr 32, Hq 270 US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq 270 US Army, 27 May 1944, a Distinguished Service Cross is awarded posthumously to:

Staff Sorgeant JOSEPH G FITTEY, 33434150, Company F, 326th Infantry Regiment, 26th Infantry Division, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy in GERMANY. On 17 - 15 February 1945, at SAMME STAM, SERVARY, Sergeant FEILEY escaped from a house hold jointly by his platoon and hostile forces and returned with reinforcements to thwart a strong enemy counterattack. With his position momentarily secured, he assisted in the evacuation of three wounded commudes cross fire-swept terrain, returning to his man just as enemy troops launched a second attack. Ordering the platoon to move to an adjoining building, he took up a position between them and the advancing enemy and so effectively diverted hostile fire to himself that his commudes were enabled to withdraw stelly, set up a defense and turn back the attack. Although he was mortally wounded, Ser each FEILEY'S gallant, unselfish actions and supreme devotion to duty him on as an insensation to the men with whom he fought.

Technician Fifth Grade WILMAN T DALEY, 32669793, Headquarters and Service Troop, 94th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron (Mechanized), United States Army. For extraordinary hereism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy in GERMANY. On 15 April 1945, when hostile tanks and supporting infentry embushed a supply column which Technica a Fifth Grade DALEY'S truck was leading into Cadussen, GERMANY, he dismounted beside his vehicle and firing his carbine from this exposed position, successfully diverted enemy fire away from his commades services cover. Larving this position for one offering a better field of fire, he ran to the deerstap of a nearby house and resumed his gallant offert, even as an enemy 75.m shell dameliance a truck close by. While the enemy maneuvered for better positions, he continued to hold them off until all of his commades had secured cover. Technician fifth Grade DALEY was mortally wounded in this action, but his unselfish courage and supreme devotion to duty wall live on in the finest traditions of the military service.

Technician Fifth Grade FORREST L VLFB, 39085568, Company G, 104th Infantry Regiment, 26th Infentry Division, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy in GERMANY. On 13 March 1945, when heavy enemy machine gun fire hold up the advance of Technician Fifth Grade, TEBB'S company in an attack near SERRIC, GERMANY, he fearlessly charged the enemy emplocament, firing as he moved. With deadly aim, he hurled a hand granded into the position and silenced the gun, but two enemy soldiers rushed to man the weapon. Finding his assumition exhausted and suffering from painful wounds, he clubbed his attackers into submission with the butt of his rifle. Although his wounds were fatal, Technician fifth Grade TEBB'S gallant (over)


tenacity enabled his corr des to attrin their objective. His heroic aggressiveness and supreme devetion to duty are in heepin; with the finest traditions of the military nervice.

Private First, Class MILTON L FINLLYSON, 34393666, Military Government Detachment F-212, Company D, 3d Military Covernment Regiment, United States Army. For wounds required as a direct result of enemy action on 11 October 1944 at VIRVIERS, FRANCE.
