AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER).** By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Bronze Star Medal previously awarded, a Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

✓ Staff Sergeant LACEY O TAYLOR, 6277895, Company A, 820th Tank Destroyer Battalion, United States Army. 17 October 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, BELGIUM, GERMANY, and CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

✓ Technician Fourth Grade FREDERICK SCHNABEL, 31420648, Detachment F-211, Company C, 3d Military Government Regiment, United States Army. 7 March 1945 to 8 May 1945 in GERMANY.

**II. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (POSTHUMOUS).** By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is posthumously awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

✓ Private First Class WILBERT W GOMER, 33539570, Reconnaissance Company, 820th Tank Destroyer Battalion, United States Army. 12 December 1944 to 30 April 1945 in BELGIUM, GERMANY, and CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

**III. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL.** By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

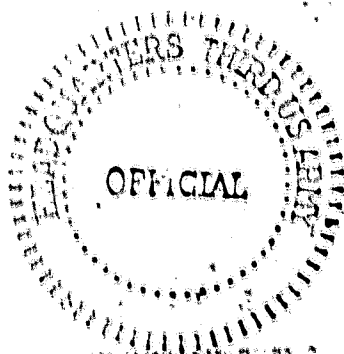
