I. AMARD OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1 1/14, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1914, a Distinguished Service Cross is awarded posthumously to:

Licutenant Colonel BARRY D BROWNE, C21099, Field Artillory, Hoadquarters
120th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For extraordinary
heroism in connection with military operations against an armod enemy. The
skillful, heroic leadership Colonel BROWNE displayed while leading his men against
strong enemy forces near BASTOGNE, BELGIUM, during the period 20 December to 24
December 1944, distinguishes him as an outstanding commander. He was continually
with the front line troops, inspiring and encouraging them by his courageous
personal example. On one occasion Colonel BROWNE personally led five tanks and
two squads of infantry in a bold attack on an enemy column, inflicting heavy
lesses of men and material. On another occasion he directed the fire of his
battalion from an exposed position in his 1-tem truck, completely disregarding
his own safety. Colonel BROWNE'S conspicuous hereism, inspiring leadership, and
loyal devotion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the military service.

First Lioutenant EDGAR C HEIST, 01014283, Infantry, Commany "D", 70th Tank Battalion, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy. The fearless leadership and conspicuous courage Lieutenant HEIST repeatedly displayed while leading his men during action against a strong enemy counter-officiative in LUXEMPOURG distinguishes him as an outstanding officer. He boldly led his men against everwhelming edds, encouraging and inspiring them by his personal, heroic example. On 22 December 1944, when leading a force of tanks against the enemy, Lieutenant HEIST'S tank was fired upon by an enemy rocket launcher. Although he had been wounded by a sniper, the Lieutenant dismounted in order to locate his assailant, and was killed while so engaged. His bold, aggressive actions and supreme devotion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the military service.

Private First Class LEO G SAIBOROUSKI, 33463330, Company "F", 5th Ranger Infantry Battalion, United States Army. For extraordinary hereism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy. Private SAIBOROUSKI, an automatic rifleman in Company "F", 5th Ranger Infantry Battalion displayed conspact uous hereism during action in LAUTERPACH, GERMARY on 3 December 1944. He coarding troops and silenced it by fire from his automatic rifle. As the attacking units advanced, private SAIBOROUSKI remained in his exposed position making maximum use of his weapon until he was killed by enemy machine-gun fire. His courage and supreme devotion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the military service.

II. AMARD OF SILVER STAR - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Silver Star is awarded posthumously to:

First Lioutenant EVERETT W SHADDEN, Oly6183, Signal Corps, Dotachment 7, 166th Signal Photographic Company, United States Army. For gallantry in action. The conspicuous courage Lieutenant SHADDEN displayed while photographing an ongagement of the 90th Infantry Division on 22 July 1914 near HAY, FRINCE, distinguishes him as an outstanding officer. Lieutenant SHADDEN was killed by an exploding enomy mortar round while performing his mission. His determination and supreme devetion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the military service.

III. AMARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is amarded to:

Colonel OLA A NELSON, Olle78, coast Artillery Corps, Fradquarters 24th Antiaircraft Artillery Group, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 1 August 1944 to 31 January 1945.

Lioutenant Colonel BRUCE H SISLER, 0277717, Medical Corps, 104th Evacuation Hospital, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 16 September 1944 to 1 February 1945.

Lioutenant Colonel CHARLES M CROSS, 0276151, Ordnance Department, 26th Ordnance Battalien, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 18 July 1944 to 1 February 1945.
