I. AMAND OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1914, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1914, a Distinguished Service Cross is awarded posthumously to:

Private First Class DALE T FROCTOR, 17197213, Company "K", 301st Infantry Regiment, 94th Infantry Division, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy. On 29 September 1944, Private PROCTOR was serving as a telephone operator observer with the 301st Infantry Regiment during action near FONT SCORFF, FRANCE. He was severely wounded when the enemy concentrated an artillery tarrage on his position, but he remained at his post and continued to give accurate fire directions as aid men were dressing his wounds. Even then, although suffering great pain, he pleaded to be allowed to continue, and it was necessary to pry the telephone from his hand in order to evacuate him. This brave soldier died from his wounds the following day, but his conspicuous heroism, his courageous determination, and supreme devotion te duty live on as an inspiration to his follow coldiers.

11. AWARD OF BRONZE OAK-LEAF CHUSTER - By Direction of the Fresident and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Har 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Silver Star previously awarded, the award of a Bronze Cor-Leaf Cluster to the following named officer on 31 January 1945 is announced:

Injor General PAUL W BAADE, 03099, United States Army, 35th Infantry Division, United States Army. For gallantry in action. During the period 7 to 13 August 1944, the 35th Infantry Division, under General BAADE'S command, was committed at IDETAIN, FRANCE, to stom a strong enemy counter-offensive and to rescue an infantry battalion which had been surrounded. During this action General BAADE was constantly with his front line troops, inspiring and encouraging them by has courageous personal example. Under his gallant leadership the Division accomplished its mission and relieved the besieged battalion. His conspicuous hereism, supreme devotion to duty, and exceptional skill examplify the highest traditions of the military service.

The conspicuous heroism. Sergeant FERNINGTON displayed while engaged in clearing an enemy mine field near DIEKTRCH, LUXEIBOURG, on 22 January 1915, distinguishes him as an outstanding

soldier. With complete disregard for his own safety, he went to the aid of three of his comrades who had been wounded by an exploding mine, and after they had been evacuated he remained at his task until the field was cleared. Sorgeant PERCINGTON'S conspicuous hereism and courageous devotion to duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service.

Private First Class JOHN J LAFFERTY, 35869911, Company "n", 13031 Engineer General Service Regiment, United States Army. For hereic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. On 22 January 1915, Private LAFFERTY was engaged in clearing an enemy mine field near DIEMERCH, LUXEMBOURG. He was severely wounded by an exploding 8-mine, but courageously remained at his task and explained the pattern of the mine field to his courades before he would permit hirself to be evacuated. His determination and hereic devotion to duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service.

Captain JOHN C CAFREY, CL67121, redical corps, company "c", 94th Medical cas Treatment Battalien, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 19 August 1944 to 17 February 1945.

Second Lieutenent PHYLLIS J BAILEY, N761852, Army Murse Corps, 109th Evacuation Mospital, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the UNITED KINGDOM, FRANCE and BELGIUM from 6 June 1914 to 16 February 1915.

Staff Sergoant HOWARD P COOKE, 35584055, company "B", 1303d Inginoor General Service Regiment, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Flahen and Luxembourd from 31 October 1944 to 4 February 1945.

Staff Sorgeant CHARLES K COLLIES, 15114552, Third United States Army Photo Center. For revitorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the UNITED KINGDOM and FRANCE from 1 June 1944 to 28 January 1945.
