I. AWARD OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS - By direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir No. 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir No. 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Distinguished Service Cross is awarded posthumously to:

Technician Fourth Grade PAUL FALAVOLITO, 13011940, Company "D", *** Tank
Battalion, 10th Armored Division, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism
in connection with military operations against an arms enemy. On 15 Now ther
1944, Company "D", *** Tank Battalion, was advancing against the enemy near
KIRSCHNAUMEN, FRANCE, when one of the tanks was hit and disabled by artillery
fire. Technician Fourth Grade FALAVOLITO, noticing that the hatches of the disabled tank were jammed, trapping the crew, fearlessly left the cover of his own
tank to aid his comrades. He cooly worked on the jammed hatches, ignoring the
enemy artillery fire falling around him, and freed the crew, He then returned to
his swatank and was about to mount when he heard another artillery shell coming.
Thinking first of his crew, he shouted to them to close the hatches and was
killed by the exploding shell. Technician Fourth Grade FALAVOLITO's supreme sacrifice for his comrades; his courage and he ic, unselfish devotion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the military service.

II. AWARD OF SILVER STAR - By direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir No. 32, Hg ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir No. 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Silver Star is awarded to:

First Lieutenant ANCEL G TAFLINGER, 0797935, Air Corps, *** Liaison Squadron, United States Army. For gallantry in action. On 25 December 1944 an urgent call was received for immediate surgical aid for seriously wounded men of the 101st Airborne Division defending the enemy-surrounded city of BASTOGNE, BELGIUM. Lieutenant TAFLINGER of the *** Liaison Squadron courageously volunteered for the hazardous mission of flying a medical officer of the *** Auxiliary Surgical Group into the beseiged city in a liaison plane. By adroit maneuvering he evaded the heavy antiaircraft fire encountered over the enemy-held territory and succeeded in making a landing at dusk in a small field outside the city. Later that night he returned safely to his base, again braving heavy enemy anitaircraft fire. Lieutenant TAFLINGER's outstanding heroism and his courageous devotion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the military service of the United States.

AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL - By direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir No. 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir No. 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

Private First Class WAD SILT P KODZ, 34C40619, Troop "D" * Cavalry Recornal sance Squadron (Cechenical), United States Army. For he oic achievament in connection with military operations against an enemy of the Urated States. Cn 2 December 1944, during a strong enemy count mattack in L'HOPITAL, FRANCE, a group of approximately fifteen of the greeny attack d the machine-un position from which Frivate First Class KODZ was protecting the withdrawal of friendly troops. This egldier valiantly hold his position in the face of direct fare from enony machine-juns and rocket launcher until his copreses had withdrawn to better positions. Only then did no sook safety, firing his machine-run from the hip as he withdraw. The initiative, courage, and devotion to duty demonstrated by . in vato First Class KODZ rollect great credit upon himself and the military forces of the United States.

First Lieutenant CLIVE K TEDRICK, N72939C, Army Nurse Corps, *** Evacuation Hospital (Seminopile), United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 24 Jun: 1944 to 21 December 1944.

First Lieutenant, Hans FORD T SHACKLERTE, 01541305, Modical Administrative Corps, to Evacuation Hospital, United States Arny. For moritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the UNITED KINDOM and FRANCE from 13 Larch 1744 to 21 December 1944.

Second Lieutenant MARITH W IRC. SIDE, (2047692, Medical Administrative Corps, ambulance Company (Mtz), United States Army: For moritorious service in connection, with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 5 Suptember 1944 to 19 December 1944.
