

1. ANARL (F DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS - By Direction of the president and under the revisions of Sec I, dir 32, Hq ETC US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, dir 56, Hq ETC US Army, 27 May 1964, a Distinguished Service Cross is awarded to:

Lieutonant Colonel PAUL PANDY, 0558157, Infantry, 2d Nattalien, 319th Infantry Regiment, 80th Infantry Division, United States Army. For extraordinary hereism in connection with military operations against an armod enemy in LUXEMECURG. (n. 23 December 1914), Colonel RANDY led the 319th Infantry against MEIDERSCHEID, LUXEMECURG, four miles in front of the existing front lines. The term was taken, but while defensive organization was in progress the enemy counter-attacked in force with tanks and infantry. Colonel RANDY courageously led his men against the enemy and put them to rout. The following morning during another strong counterated this intropid officer organized all available men and personally led them to defense of the command post, coally calling friendly artillery fire on his even positions. The was continuously in the front lines, inspiring the treeps by his fearless, gallant example. The conspicuous courage fearless leadership and hereic devotion to duty exemilify the highest traditions of the military service.

Captain JOSEPH S GIACOTELLO, 01311878, Infantry, Company "F", 137th Infantry no inent, 35th Infantry Division, United States army. For extraordinary horoism in connection with military operations against an armod enony in FRANCE. (n 10 Docombor 1944, Captain GIACCELLO'S company was given the mission of soizing an onomy-hold factory on the far side of the Saur River at SARREGURMINES, FRANCE. In the night, the Captain and two enlisted men crossed the river on an improvised plank bridge, assaulted the first machine-un position and killed the crew. They, entering the first factory building they killed twelve more of the enemy and a sculted the main building where for three hours they fought a superior number of the enemy among the factory machines with groundes, pictels, and finally with knives. The energy set fire to the building but the men hald their ground, and in hand-tohand combut the fearless Captain killed two of the energy. Then the rest of the company arrived, Captain GLACEBELLO led them against the remaining defenders and con-lotely annihilated them. His hereic devetien to duty, conspicuous courage and fearless, inspiring leadership exemplify the highest traditions of the military service.

which was in imminent danger of being over-run by the rapidly advancing enemy. He courageously remaind at his post and continued to direct evacuation of the patients even when the enemy had come within small arms range of the station. Through the calm courage all patients were saved from capture by the enemy. His actions and his heroic devotion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the military service.
