II. AWARD OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Ho ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1914, a Distinguished Service Cross is awarded posthumously to:

First Lieutenant FRANK T GERARD JR, 01318295, Infantry, Company "D", 417th Infantry Regiment, 76th Infantry Division, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy in GERMANY. On 7 February 1945, Ideutement GERARD and two enlisted men crossed the Sauer River into Germany on a reconnaissance patrol. The Lieutenant went forward under heavy fire to reconnoiter morter and machine-gun positions, and upon his roturn, he and his men were ambushed by a large force of the enemy. The small force engaged the enemy but were forced by superior numbers and lack of ammunition to attempt a withdrawal. Armed with just one hand grenade, the couragoous Lieutenant ordered his men to make a break for it while he remained behind to cover them. The men escaped but their brave leader was killed. His conspicuous heroism and supreme devotion to duty exemplify the finest traditions of the military service.
