I - AWARD OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL. By direction of the President and under the provisions of Section I, Circular Number 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 20 March 1944, as amended by Section I, Circular Number 56, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following individuals for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated.

Chaplain (Captain) EDMUND R. LYNN, O-546591, Chaplain's Corps, Company D, 802d Replacement Battalion, United States Army. 1 February 1945 to 30 April 1945 in LUXEMBOURG and GERMANY.

Captain ALBIN NOWOBILSKI, O8822-P, Detachment DP 5, Headquarters and Service Company, 2d European Civil Affairs Regiment, United States Army, in GERMANY.

Private First Class LESLEY W. SHEBLEY, 32936540, Company G, 386th Infantry Regiment, 76th Infantry Division, United States Army. 18 February 1945 to 17 April 1945 in GERMANY.

II - AWARD OF THE SOLDIER'S MEDAL. By direction of the President and under the provisions of Section I, Circular Number 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 20 March 1944, as amended by Section I, Circular Number 56, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 27 May 1944, a Soldier's Medal is awarded to:

Private First Class STEN R. RUNIUS, 31298535, 36th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For heroism not involving actual conflict with the enemy. On 8 July 1944, while the unit with which Private RUNIUS served was engaged with the enemy, a serious fire was started when hot shell fragments fell into the section powder pit. Explosions of powder containers rapidly spread the fire to the nearby prime movers. With complete disregard for his personal safety, Private RUNIUS dashed into the flames to aid a driver who he thought had been trapped in a vehicle. Private RUNIUS' heroic, unselfish actions reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

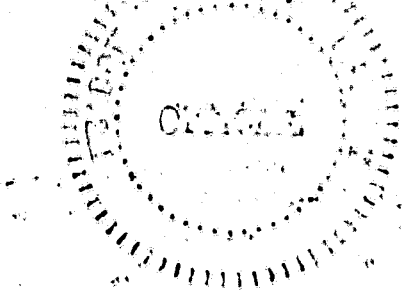
