Award of Bronze Star Medal (Oak-Leaf Cluster) I
Award of Bronze Star Medal II

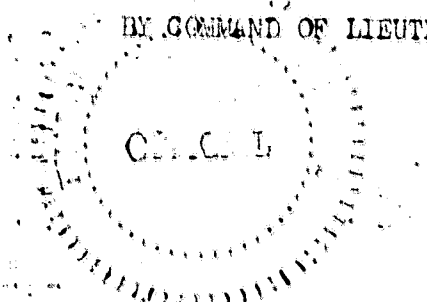
I - AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER). By direction of the President and under the provisions of Section I, Circular 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 20 March 1944, as amended by Section I, Circular 56, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 27 May 1944, in addition to the Bronze Star Medal previously awarded, a Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to:

Major NORMAN M. G. LOCKSLEY, O-25111, Field Artillery, 176th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in GERMANY. Early on the morning of 4 April 1945, Major LOCKSLEY, serving as Battalion Executive, 176th Field Artillery Battalion, was notified that Battery A was being attacked by enemy ground troops. He immediately went to the scene of action, and, in spite of the confused situation, quickly built up a firing line, evacuated casualties, and restored order to the position. As soon as dawn broke, Major LOCKSLEY directed the operations of two combat patrols which killed and captured a number of the enemy. His initiative, courage, and loyal devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

II - AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL. By direction of the President and under the provisions of Section I, Circular 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 20 March 1944, as amended by Section I, Circular 56, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective period indicated, to:

Captain HUBERT W. FREEMAN, O-385180, Field Artillery, 21st Special Service Company, Fifth United States Army. 24 March 1945 to 28 November 1945 in ITALY.
