I.- AWARD OF THE DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS. By direction of the President and under the provisions of Section I, Circular Number 32, Headquarters Euro. In Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 20 March 1944, as anchor by Section I, Circular Number 56, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, Unite States Army, dated 27 May 1944, a Distinguished Service Cross is awarded to:

Private KENNETH E. CCCANO IR, 36570983, Company A, 10th Infantry to iment, United States army. For extraordinary heroism in connection with militar, operations against an armed enemy of the United States in LUXEMECURG. On 24 danuary 1945, while Private COCANOVIR, an automatic rifleman, was advancing with the leading elements of his plateon in an attack against enemy forces near PUTCHEID, LUXEMBOURG, intense enemy tank and small arms fire pinned the plateon down. When the enemy launched a heavy counterattack supported by tanks, Private GOCANOWER fearlessly rushed forward firing his weapon in direct assault upon an enemy machine gun position. Two enemy soldiers armed with dutomatic weapons opened fire on him, but with accurate fire, he killed both and continued forward to neutralise the emplacement. Disregarding the hail of fire directed upon him, Private COCANOWER turned toward another strong point but was overcome by the concentrated fire. His indomitable cour go, dutermination and suppose devotion to duty reflect highest credit upon himself and the military service.

II. - AWARD OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL. By direction of the President and under the provisions of Section I. Circular 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, dated 20 Larch 1944, as amended by Section I. Circular 56, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States army, dated 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following individuals:

First Meutonant PETE B. TURNHAM (then second Meutenant), 0-927072, Infanty Company C, 66th Infantry Rogiment, United States Army. For heroic acid verent in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in GERMANY. On 21 April 1945, Lieutenant TURNHAM was directing his plateon in defense of hill positions near HARTENSTEIN, GERMANY, when the enemy Launched a victous attack supported by tanks. With his plateon caught in a wedge between the attacking infantry and tank units, Lieutenant fulkham repeatedly expected himself to enemy rifle and automatic weapons fire in order to place his men in advantaged positions and effectively direct, the defense. He personnally led two rocket launcher teams in the face of the attacking tanks. With fearless disregard for his personal safety, he exposed himself to intense enemy fire to direct accurate rocket fire which destroyed one tank, disabled two others, and forced the enemy to withdraw with heavy casualties. His outstanding aggressive leadership, courage and loyal devotion to duty reflect high credit upon himself and the military service:

II - AWARD OF THE PROMZE STAR MEDAL (CONTID).

Private First Class PAUL E. STEWART, 3521/316, Headquarters Company, 2d Battalion, 347th Infantry Regiment, United States army. For meritorious achiever ment in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States on 16 Pebruary 1945, Private STEWART volunteered to accompany a combat pairol as a radio operator to maintain contact with the battalion command post during the hazardous mission. When the enemy was contacted and overcome by the pitral, Private STEMART transmitted the account of the action to the command post and received additional orders for the patrol. During subsequent action, Private STEWART was subjected to small arms and automatic weapons fire, but without regard for his personal safety, he selected advantageous positions for radio trans mission and maintained excellent communication with the command post during the entire operation. His professional skill, courage, and loyal devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

III - AWARD OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL. By direction of the President and under the provisions of Section I, Circular 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States army, dated 20 March 1944, as amended by Section I, Circula-56, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States army, dated 27 Ma 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the period indicated, to:

Lieutenant CHARLES SAUTER, 1211, Infantry, Headquarters, 99th Infantry Division, United States Army, 5 December 1944 to 10 May 1945 in BEIGILT and . OFFINANY.
