I. AWARD OF SOLDIER'S MEDAL - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Soldier's Medal is awarded to:

Technician Fifth Grade CHARLES R BESHARA, 32964070, 840th Ordnance Depot Company, United States Army. For heroism not involving actual contact with the enemy in GERMANY. On 8 April 1945, at NEUKIRCHEN, GERMANY, Technician Fifth Grade BESHARA displayed conspicuous heroism in saving from destruction a burning van loaded with ordnance material. Disregarding his own safety he succeeded in removing the van from burning sheds of hay at great risk to himself. The resourcefulness Technician Fifth Grade BESHARA displayed and his courageous devotion to duty reflect the highest credit upon himself and the military service.

II. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

Technician Fourth Grade JOSEPH P NICHOLL, 33582836, 4th Auxiliary Surgical Group, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG, and GERMANY from 7 June 1944 to 14 April 1945.

III. AWARD OF AIR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER).

1. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Air Medal and six Bronze Oak-Leaf Clusters previously awarded, a seventh Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to:

Captain CLYDE M EDMONDS, 0416392, Field Artillery, 558th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in GERMANY from 1 March 1945 to 13 March 1945.

2. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Air Medal and four Bronze Oak-Leaf Clusters previously awarded, a fifth Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to:

First Lieutenant VERN L CLINE, 01177335, Field Artillery, 558th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For meritorious achievement while participat-

ing in aerial flight in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE and GERMANY from 24 January 1945 to 16 February 1945.

3. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Air Medal previously awarded, two Bronze Oak-Leaf Clusters are awarded to:

First Lieutenant MORTIMER C MCCARTHY, 0527097, Field Artillery, 558th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 31 December 1944 to 6 February 1945, and in FRANCE and GERMANY from 6 February 1945 to 23 February 1945.

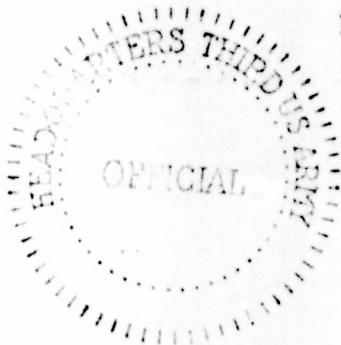
IV. REVOCATION IN SEC II, GO NO. 85 THIS HQ CS.

Colonel HARRY HULEN, 0129245, Corps of Engineers, 347th Engineer General Service Regiment, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 8 November 1944 to 19 December 1944.
