I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER). - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Bronze Star Medal previously awarded, a Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Captain GEORGE L HARTY, 01011552, Field Artillery, 58th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. 2 November 1942 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, MOROCCO, TUNISIA, SICILY, FRANCE, BELGIUM and GERMANY.

II. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL. - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Lieutenant Colonel FREDERICK W HASSELBACK JR, 022673, Field Artillery, 66th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, 4th Armored Division, United States Army. 17 July 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, BELGIUM, LUXEMBOURG, GERMANY and CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

Lieutenant Colonel WILLIAM G JOHNSON, 0319804, Quartermaster Corps, 53d Quartermaster Base Depot, United States Army. 12 February 1945 to 8 May 1945 in GERMANY.

Lieutenant Colonel OLIN E HEGUE, 0294931, Infantry, Headquarters 314th Infantry Regiment, 79th Infantry Division, United States Army. 19 June 1944 to 18 December 1944 in FRANCE and GERMANY.

First Lieutenant JAMES P ARMSTRONG, 01593437, Quartermaster Corps, 3808th Quartermaster Truck Company, United States Army. 17 June 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, BELGIUM, LUXEMBOURG, HOLLAND and GERMANY.

First Lieutenant FRANK A THOMAS, 0540586, Infantry, Headquarters Company, Third United States Army. 1 October 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG, and GERMANY.

Chief Warrant Officer RONEY A REANT, W2103359, United States Army, 53d Quartermaster Base Depot, United States Army. 28 March 1945 to 8 April 1945 in GERMANY.
