For extraordinary horoism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy in GERMANY. On 16 December 1944, near LENDERSDORF GERMANY, when the advance of Private MEY'S company was halted by withering enough fire from a tank and supporting machine guns, ho gallantly advanced alone towards the hostile tank. Although the onomy machine guns converged a devastating bail of fire upon him, he audaciously

moved to within thirty yards of the tank and with two accurately placed riflegranades forced it to withdraw. He was severely wounded during this heroic action, but his dountless courage enabled his company to advance and penetrate the enemy defenses. Private NEY's supreme devotion to duty is in keeping with the finest traditions of the military services.

Tochnical Sergoant Fack L B. DY, 31085283, Company F, 328th Infantry Augiment, 26th Infantry Division, United States army. For gallantry in - 'ion in GE. H.FY. (n 1 May 1545, during on attack against enemy-hold high ground near PAS AU GERMANY, Tochnical Sorgeant BANDY'S plateen was subjected to heavy nostile automatic weapon fire which inflicted several casualites and halted the plateen. Tounded in an attempt to neutralize the enemy strongpoint, ha withdrew for cursory medical treatment from a comrade, and then led his mon in a fierce assault against the hostile gum crow, wiping it out and destroying the weapon. Refusing to be evacuated, he supervised and assisted in the removal of the wounded to safety, and afterwards returned to lead his men on to their objective. Technical Sergeant BARDY's aggressive leadership and unflagging dovotion to duty exemplify the finest traditions of the military services.

Private First Class WILLIAM C TAYLOR, 36459495, Company A, 329th Infantry Regiment, 83d Infantry Division, United States Army. For gallantry in action in CHAINY. On 18 December 1944, when part of Private First Class TAYLOR'S patrol was driven back under heavy enemy fire across the Roer River into ROHLSDORF GEMBLAY, he courageously volunteered to return to the enemy bank

where the remaining members of the patrol had been isolated without communications. Carrying a SCR 300 radio, he reached the catualk of the blown bridge spanning the river just as a hail of enemy rifle fire from the far shore opened up, wounding him and plunging him headleng into the water. In spite of his wound, he struggled to the enemy shore where he was taken prisoner. before he could reach his belonguered comrades. Private First Class TAYLOR'S unselfish hereism and aggressive devotion to duty are in keeping with the finest traditions of the military service.

Private First Class BIGKIM'S FISK, 3111433, Headquarters Company H, 3d Filitary Government Regiment, United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in GENIMAY. On 8 May 1945, Private First Class FISK went to the aid of a security guard who had been seriously injured by an exploding mine while patrolling the east bank of the Whine River south of COLOGNE GENIMY. With utter disregard for his own safety, he crossed a wide area of mine-infested ground to render first aid to the wounded man and when three other comrades were similarly wounded, administered treatment to them and effected their exacution to safety. Private First Class FISK'S unselfish efforts and loyal devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military services.
