I. ANARD OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS (POSTHUMOUS). - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I. Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 19/4, as amonded by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US .rmy, 27 May 1944, a Distinguished Sorvice Cross is awarded posthumously to:

Staff Sorgeant EDWARD J Candidal, 32823394, Company L, 331st Infantry Regiment, 63d Infantry Division, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy in B LCIUM. Cn 19 January 1945, near Lindlad, rangial, when deadly hestile machine gun fire threatened to isolate and annihilate Sar Jant Calloll's plateon, this intropid soldier voluntarily set out to eliminate the meny position. Although a burst from the concealed gur wounded his fatally, he continued his gallant advince, and crawling to within twenty yards of the hestile employment, he tossed a well-aimed hand grenede into the midst of the erow, wiping it out and silencing the gun. Sorgeant CARROLL'S couragoous self-sacrifico enabled his beleaguered comrades to rejoin their company and continue the attack. His unflinching heroism and supreme devotion to duty live on as an inspiration to the men with whem he fought.

II. Major JOHN F CHEADLE, 0353837, General Staff Corps, Readquarters, Whird United States army. 1 August 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, LUXE BOURG, RELGIUM, GEPTINIY, CZECHOSLOVAKIA and AUSTRIA.

Captain ELDON E YOUNG, U1822761, Transportation Corps, Headquarters, Third United States Army. 50 June 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, RELETUR and CENTURY.

2 By Direction of the President and under the provisions of sec I, Cir 32, Hq BTO US Army, 20 March 194, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 Mry 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

First Lieutenant HAROLD W WRIGHT, 01591546, Quartermaster Corps, 606th Quartermaster Graves Registration Company, United States Army. For horcic achievement in connection with military operations against an every of the United States in LUXE BOURG. On 20 September 1944, while on route to a forward



Gravos Registration collecting point near CLERVAUX, LUXEMBOURG, an enomy machine gum crow opened fire from a road block on the quarter-ton truck in which Lieutenant WRIGHT was riding, wounding his driver. Without hesitation, he dismounted and with small arms fire held off the enemy forces until the truck could be turned around. Then he returned with his driver to an aid station. Lieutenant WRIGHT's da atless actions and unlike hing devotion to duty inflect great credit upon himself and the military service.
