SECTION II - Award of Bronze Star Medal.

I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER). - By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Bronze Star Medal previously awarded, a Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Lieutenant Colonel EDWARD J SCHMUCK, 0349795, General Staff Corps, Headquarters Third United States Army. 14 September 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG, BELGIUM, GERMANY, CZECHOSLOVAKIA, and AUSTRIA.

II. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL. 1. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

Private First Class JUNJI SHIROYAMA, 39087607, Company I, 442d Regimental Combat Team, United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE. On 6 November 1944, when Private First Class SHIROYAMA'S depleted company was halted by a withering hail of enemy machine gun fire during an attack near LEPANGES, FRANCE, he fearlessly crawled forward through a belt of anti-personnel mines and with deadly fire killed the gunner and forced the remainder of the hostile crew to abandon the position. Later, when his comrades were ordered to take up more tenable positions, he courageously remained behind under heavy enemy shell-fire to cover their withdrawal. Private First Class SHIROYAMA'S dauntless actions and unswerving devotion to duty reflect great credit upon himself and the military service.

2. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Major LUTHER H WOLFF, 0296324, Medical Corps, 2d Auxiliary Surgical Group, United States Army. 15 January 1945 to 2 Nov 1945 in ITALY.

Technical Sergeant FRANK J MAYVILLE, 35322761, 38th Infantry Scout Dog Platoon, United States Army. 19 September 1944 to 2 May 1945 in ITALY.

Staff Sergeant HENRY F ERK, 33418864, Headquarters Third United States Army. 1 August 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG and GERMANY.

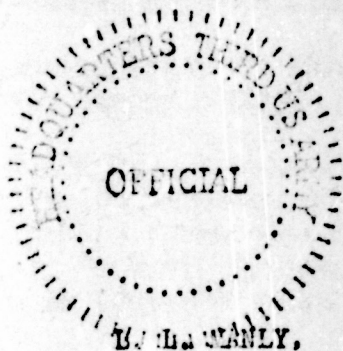
