I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER). By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 52, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Bronze Star Medal previously awarded, a Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Colonel THOMAS J HARTFORD, 018330, Medical Corps, Headquarters, Third United States Army. 6 June 1943 to 12 September 1943 in the UNITED KINGDOM.

II. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL. By Direction of the president and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 52, Hq ET US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Captain ARTHUR E ELLIOTT, 0534713, Army of the United States, Detachment F-206, Company G, 3d Military Government Regiment, United States Army. 17 October 1944 to 21 April 1945 in FRANCE and GERMANY.

Sergeant LINDSAY LOGAN JR, 31357701, Battery C, 272d Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. 1 May 1945 to 8 May 1945 in GERMANY.

III. AWARD OF PURPLE HEART MEDAL. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, the Purple Heart Medal is awarded to:

Private First Class LEON EITGENBAUM, 35894336, 552d Military Police Escort Guard Company, United States Army. For wounds received as a direct result of enemy action on 15 April 1945 in GERMANY.

Private First Class JOHN MESSINA, 42120509, 301st Signal Operation Battalion, United States Army. For wounds received as a direct result of enemy action on 7 April 1945 in GERMANY.

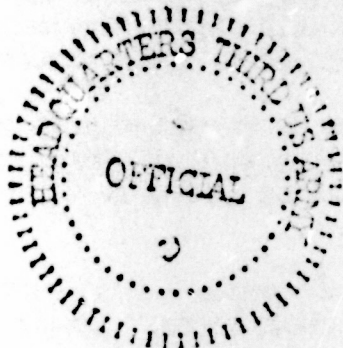
