I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (2D OAK-LEAF CLUSTER). By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Bronze Star Medal previously awarded, a 2d Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Major WILLIAM F TUCKER, 0475392, Signal Corps, 69th Signal Battalion, United States Army. 18 February 1945 to 8 May 1945 in GERMANY.

II. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER). By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Bronze Star Medal previously awarded, a Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Captain ROBERT E JOANIS, 0362729, Infantry, Service Company, 745th Tank Battalion, United States Army. 1 April 1944 to 8 May 1945 in the UNITED KINGDOM, FRANCE, BELGIUM and GERMANY.

III. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL. By Direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 March 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, to:

Master Sergeant HENRY H LIPP, 6542535, Service Company, 18th Infantry Regiment, 1st Infantry Division, United States Army. 6 June 1944 to 8 May 1945 in FRANCE, BELGIUM, GERMANY and CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

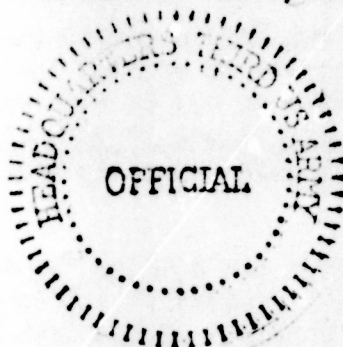
