I. AMARD OF CAK-LEAF CLUSTER - By direction of the President and under the previsions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETC US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hz ETC US Army, 27 May 1944, in addition to the Distinguished Service Cross previously awarded, the award of a Bronze Cak-Leaf Cluster to following named officer on 16 November 1944 is announced:

Colonel DWIGHT T COLLEY, C166222, Infantry, \*\* Infantry Regiment, 26th Infantry Division, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in commection with military operations against an armed enemy. On 8 November 1914, the \*\* Infantry Regiment, commanded by Colonel COLLEY, as an integral part of a general offensive conducted by the 26th Infantry Division, was assigned the mission of reducing a succession of heavily fortified enemy positions east of TANCY, FRANCE, including strongly defended towns. Colonel COLLEY, exhibiting outstanding leadership and remarkable tactical ability skilfully organized his command and with great courage and initiative fearlessly led his regiment in the attack. His personal bravery under intense enemy fire inspired his nen to take the assigned objective despite stubborn enemy resistance, contributing in great measure to the successful accomplishment of the Division's mission. Colonel COLLEM's heroism and loyal devotion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the military forces of the United States.

II. ALAPD OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS - By direction of the president and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1914, as amended by Sec/I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1914, a Distinguished Service Cross is awarded posthumously to:

Second Lieutenant MERSHEL T HARDIN, 01325645, Infantry, \*\* Infantry Regiment, 30th Infantry Division, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an a med enemy. On 5 September 1944, Lieutenant HARDIN led his rifle platoon of the \*\* Infantry in an assault upon FORT VILLEY LE SEC near TOUL, FRANCE. The enemy position, a concrete and steel pillbox located on the crest of a hill, was well fortified, and when Lieutenant HARDIN's platoon had advanced a hundred yards it was pinned down by intense machine-gun fire. Lieutenant HARDIN, with complete disregard for his own safety, worked his way forward, located the concealed enemy gun position, and wiped it out with his submachine-gun. His platoon then advanced until it was again stopped by fire. Again, Lieutenant HARDIN courageously braved intense fire, noving forward until he located the gun. To pinned the enemy down with his submachine-gun

ritil he was within thirty yards of their position and destroyed them with grenedes. Thile he was so engaged, an enemy sollier wounded him in both legs with renades. He killed that enemy and difter having his wounds dressed by a medical orpsman continued to lead his plato a in the attack. The heroic, inspiring leadership of Lieutenant HANDIN; his courage and supreme devotion to duty exemplithe highest traditions of the mili ary forces of the United States.


