I. AVERD OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS - By direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir No. 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Par 1 14, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Distinguished Service Cross is awarded posthumously to:

Second Lieutenant CHARLES C WETZEL, 01320206, Infantry, Company "I", ** Infantry Regiment, 90th Infantry Division, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy. On 12 June 1914, in the attack on AFREVILLE, FRANCE, Libut mant WETZEL's battalion was hoavily ongaged with strongly resisting enemy forces, and the platoon under Lieutonant WIT El's command, having suffored several casualties, was pinned down by intense enemy fire. Observing that the left flank of the plateon was in the greatest danger, Lieutenant WETZEL went to that part of the line. It was under extremely heavy machine-gun fire and the enemy was also throwing many hand gronades, several of which Licutenant WETZEL picked up before they exploded and hurled back into their positions. At this point in the engagement he was wounded in the leg, but after satisfying himself as to the security of the left flank, Lioutenant WETZEL, despite his wounds, dragged himself to a position in the center of the platoon in order to better direct the fighting. Here he was again wounded, but still refusing to be byaquated he remained with the platoon, moving forward and closing with the enemy in hand to hand fighting until he was killed in action. The extraordinary courcin of Lieutemant WETZEL, his heroic, determined leadership and his supreme divotion to dity exemplify the highest traditions of the military forces of the United States.

Provisions of Suc I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, the award of the Pronze Star Todal to the following named officer on 25 November 1944 is announced:

Major Goneral WILLIAM H H MORRIS JR. 03102, United States Army, 10th Armored Division, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 15 Hevember 1944; to 20 November 1944.

First Lieutenant MAK L GARLAND, 01165292, Field Artillery, ** Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight in connection with military operations against an enemy of the
