I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL - By direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, HQ ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, HQ ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

✓ Private GEORGE E KLINGER, 33503444, Company "E", ** Signal Operation Battalion, United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. Private KLINGER distinguished himself while serving as a Third United States Army messenger. On 21 November 1944, while on a mission near GRAVELOT, FRANCE, the vehicle in which he was riding was wrecked by a well-camouflaged enemy mine. Private KLINGER, exhibiting extreme devotion to duty, removed the messages from the wrecked vehicle and, although suffering from shock and severe chest pains, proceeded for three miles on foot, aided by his driver, until assistance was received from a passing military vehicle. His courage and determination reflect great credit upon himself and the military forces of the United States.

✓ Lieutenant Colonel SAZLEY W JOHNSON, 0281580, Ordnance Department, Headquarters of Ordnance Battalion, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 20 July 1944 to 1 December 1944.

✓ Major JOHN J THORPE, 0361125, Medical Corps, Headquarters ** Medical Gas Treatment Battalion, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the UNITED KINGDOM and FRANCE from 21 May 1944 to 26 October 1944.

✓ Major JOHN E SCHACHT JR, 0350421, Coast Artillery Corps (AA), Headquarters ** Antiaircraft Artillery Group, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 7 June 1944 to 9 August 1944.

✓ Captain DONALD J HUCKAFY, 0305726, Field Artillery, ** Field Artillery Battalion, 90th Infantry Division, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 7 June 1944 to 30 September 1944.

✓ Captain EDWARD PEYSER, 01576198, Quartermaster Corps, ** Quartermaster Gasoline Supply Company, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 20 September 1944 to 20 November 1944.

Captain JAMES D REYNOLDS, 01546050, Medical Administrative Corps, Headquarters ** Medical Battalion, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 13 August 1944 to 25 September 1944.

First Lieutenant HARRY L BARR, 01518028, Ordnance Department, ** Ordnance Heavy Maintenance Company, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 20 August 1944 to 27 November 1944.

Master Sergeant CHARLES W STETTER, 33076774, Headquarters Battery, ** Anti-aircraft Artillery Group, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 9 June 1944 to 15 August 1944.

Technical Sergeant EDWARD J WOLZ, 33000809, Headquarters ** Medical Battalion, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 1 August 1944 to 15 October 1944.

Staff Sergeant JAMES M FLEMING, 14135965, ** Ordnance Heavy Maintenance Company (Field Artillery), United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 3 November 1944 to 14 November 1944.

Technician Third Grade WILLIAM J WELSH, 14135999, ** Ordnance Heavy Maintenance Company (Field Artillery), United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 5 September 1944 to 15 November 1944.

Technician Fourth Grade JOHN P WISEHAUF, 37651610, Headquarters Third United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in FRANCE from 1 August 1944 to 23 November 1944.
