Entered United States Military Academy from Massachusetts.

✓ WALTER J. MULLER, 012224, COLONEL, G.S.C., Headquarters Third United States Army, then assigned Headquarters Seventh Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States from 10 July 1943 to 17 August 1943 in the Sicilian Campaign. Entered United States Military Academy from United States at large.

THOMAS H. NIXON, 09326, COLONEL, Ordnance Department, Headquarters Third United States Army, then assigned Headquarters Seventh Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States from 10 July 1943 to 17 August 1943 in the Sicilian Campaign. 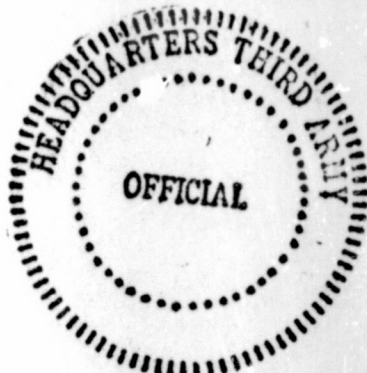
