I. AMADD OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS - By direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1) 14, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1914, a Distinguished Service Cross is awarded to:

Infantry Battalion, 4th Armored Division. For extraordinary heroism in or section with military operations against an armed enemy at TROYES, FRANCE. During the afternoon and evening of 25 August 1944, Major ARTHUR L WEST JR. led an armored attack against the city, pushing the attack home with great speed and vigor in spite of heavy mortar, shell, and small arms lire. At one time during the attack Major NEST came face to face with a German anti-tank gun and killed the crew with his sub-machine gun. Although one tire of his vehicle was blown off by an enemy shell a continued to lead the attack and to hold the city against far superior force all relieved the next day. So successful was the attack that the enemy losse killed, wounded, and captured, were 1100 as compared to 60 casualties in Major WEST'S command. The heroic actions of Major WEST reflect the highest credit upon the Military Service of the United States.

II. AWAID OF SILVER STAR.

1. By direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Silver Star is awarded posthumously to:

Army, Troop "A", ** Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron (Mechanized). For gallantry in action on 7 August 1944 near POIT SCORF, FRANCE. Technician Fifth Grade EUGENE BERKOWITZ was serving as radio operator in an armored car when the head-quarters of Combat Come and "B" of the 4th Armored Division was subjected to a heavy enemy artillary barrage. Technician Fifth Grade BERKOWITZ, with utter disregard for his own safety, remained at his radio, transmitting messages, until ordered to abandon the armored car. Upon leaving the armored car, Technician Fifth Grade BERKOWITZ was fatally wounded by shell-fire. This hereic devotion to duty at the cost of his own life resulted in the maintenance of communications until shell fire rendered the armored car and radio unusable, and exemplifies the highest traditions of the Armored car and radio unusable, and exemplifies


2. By direction of the president and under the presistent of Sec I, Cir 52, rg 510 US army, 20 Har 1944, as arounded by Sec I, Cir 55, rg 370 US army, 27 Hay 1944, a Silver Star is awarded to:


Gorperal RODERT W CADY, 37299267, Coast Artillery Corps, United States Army, at Intiairer of Artillary Cum Battalion (Looile). For gallantry in action at POITABLLE, FRANCE on the night of 8-9 August 1944. Coaperal CaDY was on duty at his assigned position in a 90 millimater antiairer of the grant omplacement when his buttery position was attached by enemy aimer of twhich dropped many antirersonnel bombs. One of these bombs struck Corporal CaDY, buckling him down.
The bomb failed to explade. Utterly disregarding his personal safety, Corporal
Cady iched up the bomb, carried it outside the gun emplacement, and covered it
with sundags. To have thrown the bomb from the emplacement would have endangered
the lives of other personnel in the vicinity of the gun. Corporal Gady's courageous action while under enemy attack saved his comrades from a potentially

THI. ATTUM OF SOLDIER'S MEDIL - By direction of the President and under the provision of Sec I, Cir 32, Eq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1 Mar, as exceeded by Sec I, Cir 56, 49 ETO US Army, 27 May 19M4, the Soldier's Model is awarded to:

States Army, ** Ordinance Medium Paintenance Company. For heroism not involving actual conflict with an enemy. In the early morning hours of 16 August 19th at LE MAIS, FRANCE, a fire caused by a leaking faul tank in a field range enveloped the interior of a moss truck of the ** Ordinance Tedium Maintenance Company.

Staff Sorgaint John & Sidual, Mass Sorgaint of this unit, promptly and without regard for his own personal safety, entered the mass truck and, surplied with extinguishing the fire. By his cool and cours your action, Staff Sorgaint Sidual saved valuable mess equipment from destruction, and prevented a violation of blackout security which might have produced serious consequences in view of the presence of energy aircraft in the vicinity.




