I. AWARD OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS - By direction of the President and under the provisions of Sec I, Cir 32, Hq ETO US Army, 20 Mar 1944, as amended by Sec I, Cir 56, Hq ETO US Army, 27 May 1944, a Distinguished Service Cross is awarded to:

Lieutenant Colonel CREIGHTON W ABRAMS, 020296, Cavalry (Armored), \*\*\*
Tank Battalion, 4th Armored Division, United States Army. For extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy. Colonel ABRAMS was commanding the \*\* Tank Battalion on 20 September 1944 near ARRACOURT FRANCE, when two of his tank companies were cutflanked and seriously disorganized by an armored attack of superior enemy forces. Quickly and accurately estimating the situation, this officer unhesitatingly attacked the enemy force with his command tank, striking with such ferocity that the enemy was thrown into a state of confusion, and his own forces were able to regroup. In the face of approaching darkness, Colonel ABRAMS then daringly led his reorganized companies in a frontal assault which resulted in the complete rout of the enemy and the capture of a valuable position with a considerable amount of enemy supplies. Colonel ABRAMS: rapid and heroic action, undertaken with great initiative and brilliant leadership, was largely responsible for this successful action and was an inspiration to all who witnessed it.
